Dear Lliswerry Parents, Carers and Learners

54% - Outstanding GCSE Results

As Christmas approaches, I can report that it has been another very busy term. Lliswerry High's outstanding results this summer have been much discussed across the region and we have been happy to welcome a number of other schools who have visited us to find out how we support our learners to do so well.

72% Level 2 English – 2nd Highest in Newport!

Some of our visitors have focused on English as the headline states, they were the second highest results across all the schools in Newport. School to school support is an effective method of raising standards and Mr Benjamin has been discussing his strategies with several schools both in Newport and beyond.

The success above have been reached through a number of strategies and we have repeated this approach this term with the current Year 11. These all include additional support sessions for targeted learners to give them the best possible chance of success in the exams. This term we have run:

November Maths Challenge, January Science Challenge and the January English Challenge

Operation Christmas Child

95 boxes of gifts were collected in Lliswerry this year to send to children across the world. Mrs Maynard and helpers from 9CM galvanised us into action and we can celebrate our Christmas knowing we have brought joy to the lives of 95 children who are less fortunate than ourselves.



October Harvest Charity

Each year our governor, Mr Prosser, leads us in our harvest assemblies. As we have for a number of years we support Muumba School in Zambia and this year Mr Prosser showed the school the toys that the African children had made. These included musical items and wheel along toys made from wire and rags. We also saw the footballs the children play with, made from rolled up carrier bags. Year groups were challenged with making footballs from discarded items - and a number of footballs were made by Lliswerry High learners. We therefore raised money to provide sporting equipment for the children in Muumba School. We also brought in items of food for the food banks in Newport.

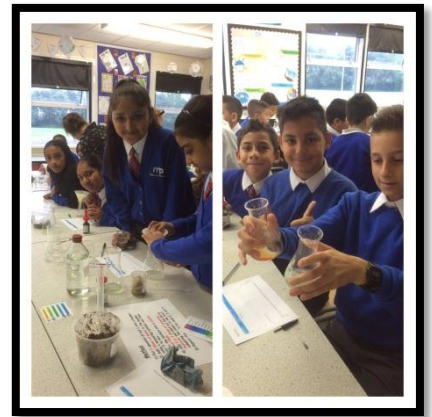

Technique Workshop - Making Tracks

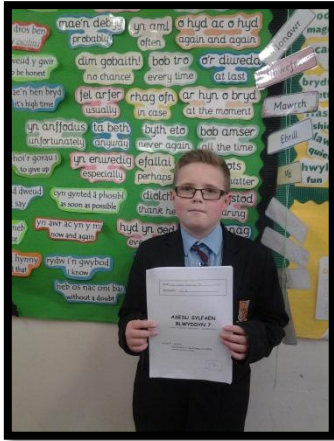


Technique came to Lliswerry High School on the 19th October to run a workshop for all Year 7 learners called Making Tracks. This workshop links key skills such as communication and Numeracy with problem solving in a real life context. In this workshop, learners took on the role of designers and engineers.

The Making Tracks workshop focused on the World Wide Aid distribution of food and medical supplies to areas hit by natural disasters. In the workshop learners were asked to design and engineer an all-terrain vehicle to transport important supplies to the disaster region. The learners, working in groups, had to build the vehicle with only limited time and budget. Once built the groups tested their prototype to assess its performance and to see if it met the various safety requirements specified in the brief. The Year 7 learners thoroughly enjoyed the day and it was good to see the various groups working together so well to complete the task. One learner even commented “that this was the best lesson he had ever had in his life, including Primary school.

Attendance

In our recent assemblies we gave out 100% badges to well over 100 of our Key Stage 3 learners who have not missed a day since September as well as giving £10 gift voucher to our attendance raffle winners. Every learner who has 93% attendance gets their name put in the hat once, rising to 5 times if their attendance is 100%, thus increasing your chance to win the raffle!

Year 7 have been set an interesting challenge by Mr Coughlin, their Head of Key Stage. If Year 7 attendance is 97% or above by July 1st 2017 he will allow the learners to shave all his hair off in assembly!

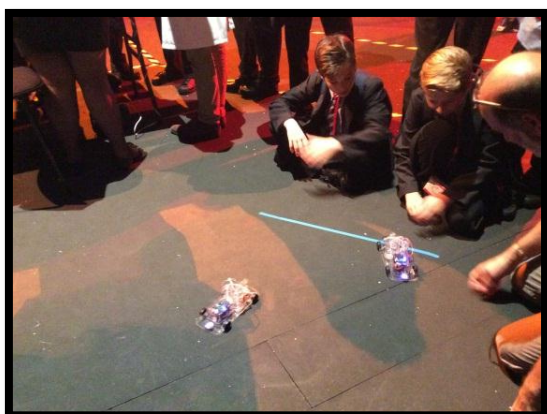
Year 8 STEM (Science) Trip

Is it possible for humans to live on Mars...?

How would we travel, grow food, and keep warm & healthy.....?



32 lucky Year 8 learners spent the day at Cardiff University as rookies for M.E.T.S Special Operations exploring, investigating and answering some of these questions. The only attributes that our learners needed at the start of their mission were curiosity, creativity, belief that anything is possible and the will to want to make a difference!



The learners learned about computer science, geology, architecture, DNA, chemistry, physics, maths, astronomy, engineering & nutrition. They were able to test the effects of asteroid impact on rockets (using Nerf guns!), use thermal imaging software & control robots with computers amongst other things which was a new experience for the majority.

By the end of the day most of our learners began to see the STEM subjects (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) in an entirely different light! This will, we hope, give them food for thought when it comes to choosing their subject options in Year 9.

Year 12 Nuffield Fellowships Awards Evening

4 of last year's year 12 learners were awarded Nuffield fellowships in the summer. This involved spending 4-6 weeks in a university or private company team working on real life research problems. The projects they worked on ranged from antibiotic resistance to finding out whether sitting down made arthritis worse. On 3rd October, they had an awards evening at Technique where they were able to present the work they had done as a poster and all received a certificate from Professor Sir Martin Evans, a Nobel prize winner.

This is a fantastic achievement for the learners concerned and will provide a real advantage for them when applying to university.



Coleg Y Cymoedd - Diploma in Foundation Studies Art and Design Presentation

On Monday 10th October Jeremy Spencer, a lecturer from Coleg Y Cymoedd, visited our Art team and presented to Year 12 and 13 Art and Design learners. Jeremy informed learners of the benefits of applying for a Foundation Art course prior to University for Art based careers. Learners were shown work of previous learners from the Foundation course and were given the opportunity to question Jeremy about the course and application procedures. Year 12 and 13 learners found it a very interesting and informative experience and many have now confirmed that they will be applying for the course.

Year 11 Welsh Baccalaureate

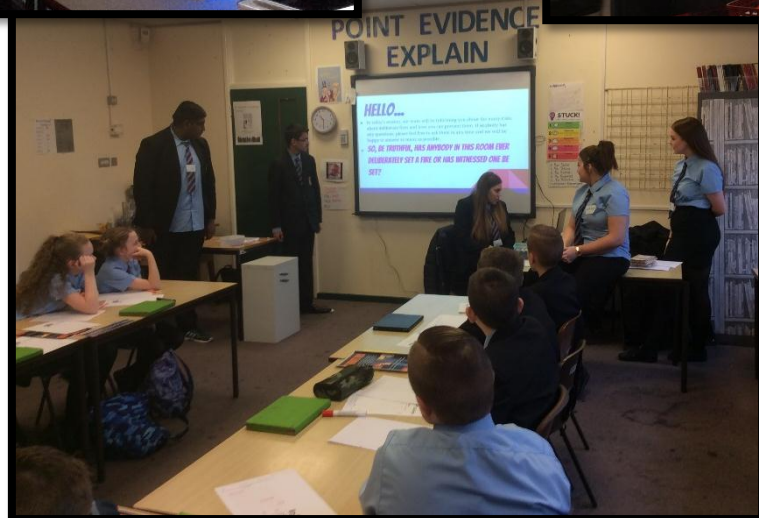
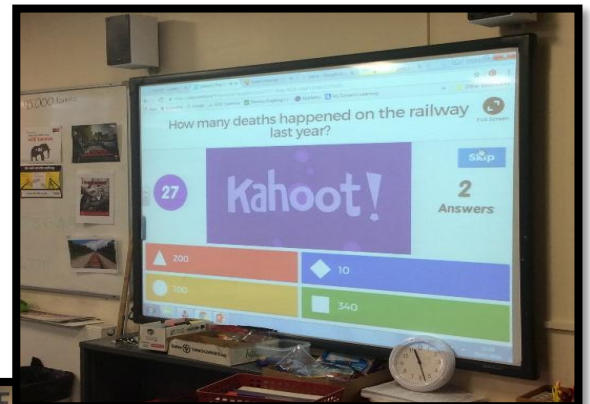

Local Author Impresses Lliswerry Learners



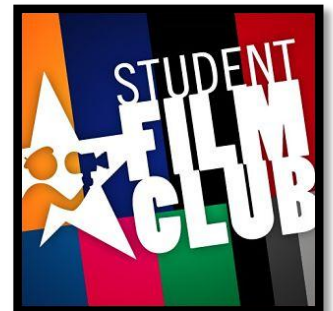
The annual Open Evening in September saw the English team joined by local author and primary school teacher, Paul Manship. That name may sound familiar to many Lliswerry learners as he is a teacher at a local primary school. As part of their transition from their primary to Lliswerry High School, year 7 study one of Paul Manship's books, 'Rewind'. 'Rewind' is about a young mischievous boy called Artie who goes to primary school in Bettws, Newport. Artie meets a mysterious stranger who gives him the gift of turning back time

to start the day again. Then, he can correct some of the mistakes he has made and get out of trouble. In the end, Artie learns that the best way to make things better is to be a good person.

At the Open Evening, a group of learners from 7CB and 8SKJ created a news report of Mr Manship's visit. The report included an interview with the author by Siddhartha Rai, 8SKJ. Mr Manship answered questions that had been written by year 7 learners in their English lessons about both his writing and teaching career. Paul Manship commented on how impressed he was with the questioning skills of Year 7. From the report, we found out who had been Paul's greatest influence; who had supported him the most during his writing; and what book he is working on at the moment. Paul then chose the winners of the book cover and letter competition, with winners from 7CHP receiving signed copies of his books. The final news report was then premiered to year 7 classes in the final week before half term.

Years 8 & 9 MAT Film Club

The English team has started a new film club for More Able and Talented (MAT) learners in Years 8 and 9. They watch and discuss a film, then complete enrichment tasks to stretch learners' understanding and abilities. They are able to spend more time discussing how issues relate to learners' lives. It gives learners an opportunity to express their views with peers in an environment which allows them to deepen their thinking. The film club has a relaxed and informal atmosphere, where learners are free to express their views. Each half term a new teacher takes the club so learners can gain from different teachers' styles and expertise, as well as their taste in films.

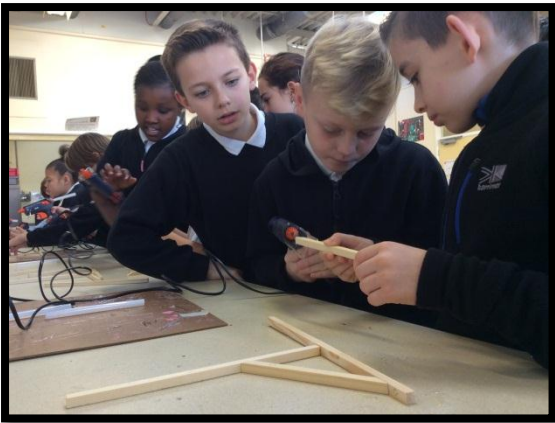


St Andrew's Primary School - Cluster Control Project

Lliswerry High School were delighted to welcome almost 60 Year 6 learners in two classes from St. Andrew's Primary School to take part in a Lliswerry Cluster Control Project.

The project was in three parts and each class spent two days with us. In ICT, they were taught about how to use a Raspberry Pi, which is a small computer that can be programmed to perform various functions. In Science, the lesson was about electronics and soldering, then in Design and Technology, they learnt all about structures. In ICT, Mr Luff taught the class about coding and programming the Raspberry Pi's to work with small wheeled robots that could then be controlled using specific keys from a computer keyboard. Year 6 then made a pressure pad with a buzzer attached to sense when the robot passed over it. In Technology, Mr Bootle taught the class about how structures can be made stronger through triangulation. They made a see-saw bridge, just wide enough for the robots to travel over.

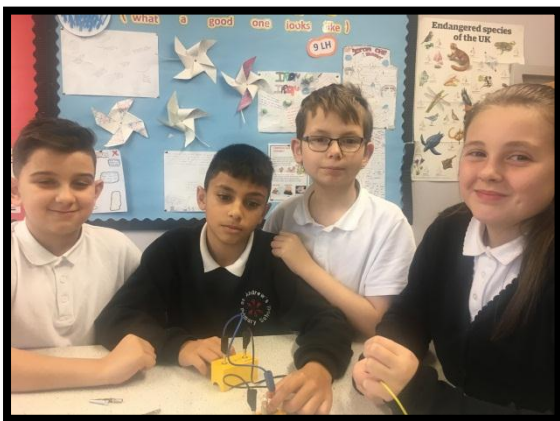
The three projects were then put together so that the robots could be raced against each other, with points awarded for each team. The winning team were then presented with prizes and all learners who took part were awarded a certificate of achievement. As you can see from the photographs, St Andrew's learners thoroughly enjoyed their time with us and had the opportunity to use a variety of tools, machinery, equipment and processes in our school. We look forward to welcoming other Primary Schools in our cluster to participate in similar learning experiences.
