Dear Parent/Carer,

It's that time of year once again where I marvel at how quickly the year has flown by and reflect on how so much has happened once again. Seeing my own daughter leave Year 6 today really has reminded me of how quickly time flies!

This year has been another very successful one in many ways, including our continuing improvement in the quality of teaching and learning and learners' progression in skills (literacy, numeracy and digital) and their development of subject knowledge. I also look back with admiration at the way our staff pulled together through some very difficult periods of covidenforced staff absence to ensure that we never once had to close to any year groups. Thankfully full lockdowns feel like they happened a long time ago, but we must all continue to be vigilant of course.

I also look back with admiration at the way our learners returned to full time school this year and to 'old school' exams once again. I never stop being impressed by the resilience of young people, their ability to adapt and move on whilst seemingly taking everything in their stride. Some of our learners have found this more difficult than others of course and their determination is also very worthy of recognition.

As I've just mentioned, exams have returned once again this year. Given that learners throughout the country haven't had the benefit of being able to practise for these over recent years, it remains to be seen how outcomes may or may not be affected. What I do know is that if your child did their absolute best then that is all anyone can ask of them and whatever results days bring this summer it will not define them nor should it diminish their ambitions. A letter about results days will be with you shortly if you haven't already received it by the time this newsletter is shared with you!

There are many positive items in this newsletter and our learners have achieved too many to include them all unfortunately. An incredible 372,102 positive behaviour points have been awarded to (and earned by) our learners this school year and this truly is a phenomenal total. Well done to them all!

In readiness for the new term (please see key info in this newsletter for dates), please can I ask that all parents and carers take note of our uniform rules and the uniform information in this newsletter. Most of our learners attend school smartly dressed in correct school uniform. However, as the recent uniform letter mentioned one area we would ask for your support with is that 'currently the length of some girls' skirts is not appropriate for school, however we have not asked parents/carers to purchase new skirts so close to the end of term' We do ask that this is addressed in time for September please. Thank you for your understanding with this.

Similarly, we would ask for your support with attendance and punctuality. Whilst we have many learners whose attendance is superb, too many learners currently have poor attendance and punctuality (some are even dropped off late to go to the shop opposite the school). We understand that it's not always possible, nor reasonable for a learner to be in school. However, I'm sure that no one would argue with the fact that poor attendance and punctuality has a massive impact on learners' progress and success and certainly doesn't develop the habits needed for holding down a job later on in life.

Looking ahead to our learning for September, we are very excited to be officially delivering the new Curriculum for Wales, with its focus on developing the 'four purposes'. These 'four purposes' have been included in our updated school mission statement below. Please do let us know if you have any comments or suggestions in relation to our updated mission statement.

'Our mission is to be the best school in Wales.

In our school community, all learners are ready to learn and make progress appropriate to their ability in every lesson.

We embody a culture of kindness, inclusivity, ambition, belief, determination and resilience.

Through our learner led, creative and engaging curriculum all of our learners are:

- •Enterprising, creative contributors ready to play a full part in life and work





Social Mobility Fund

As Year 12 start to consider their options for life beyond Sixth Form, many have attended talks and presentations from a number of universities and those who work alongside them, including the Social Mobility Fund. This offers programmes to Year 12 learners who are considering a number of careers.

Following a presentation and a rigorous application process, Saimah Meah, Abigail Abraham, Charlize Booth, Chardonnay Hughes and Rachael Huddleston-Smith were offered a place on the Aspiring Professionals Programme.

To date, this has given them the opportunity to attend a launch event, a university choices webinar, a confidence & resilience workshop and skills for success workshop. The programme continues with events and opportunities during the coming months, including more career insight days, a making a statement workshop, a CV & mock interview workshop, and visits to more Russell Group Universities. Top employers around the country will also host internships during the summer holidays and October half term which some of our learners will have the privilege to attend.

A busy term for Rachael!

The Social Mobility Fund Aspiring Professionals Programme has given Year 12's Rachael Huddleston-Smith the opportunity of a week's placement with a London based law firm in August which she is very much looking forward to.

In addition to this, keen to study Law at university, Rachael has also made the most of the opportunities offered to her by the SEREN programme. As well as attending an online summer school with Oxford University, Rachael has been offered a place at Cambridge University's Churchill and Trinity College Arts and Humanities Residential. She was selected out of over 1200 applicants and will spend 4 days at the university in August. The university confirmed that this was "one of the most competitive residentials ever run by the university, and it's testament to the strength of Rachael's academic potential and application that she has been chosen to attend!"

Back in January, Rachael also applied for the Sutton Trust US programme. This is a lengthy and rigorous process and she was again selected out of over 1000 students. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to explore what studying in the US is like and it gives a taste of what it's like being an international student in the US. So far, Rachael has attended online events and a residential at Nottingham University as part of the programme. Although the trip to the US that this programme usually offers is unfortunately still unable to go ahead as a result of the pandemic, there will be further events for Rachael to attend in the coming weeks.

Well done Rachael and we look forward to working with you on your UCAS application in the months ahead!



Biometrics

The school is using a Biometric payment system for catering, which is a quicker and easier way for learners to purchase food/drinks from the school canteen.

If you wish to register your son/daughter for this system, forms are available from the school reception. Once we have received the completed form learners will be registered the same day. This is a more efficient way for them to get their lunch instead of them remembering a 4 digit code. Alternatively you can contact us at admin@lliswerryhigh.org given authorisation for your child to have biometrics set up.

Contact Details

Attendance

If your child is unwell you need to report the absence daily, you can either email the school at **admin@lliswerryhigh.org** contact us through the school comms app or telephone the school.

KEY INFORMATION

Learner Support

At Lliswerry High we want to create an outstanding climate for learning. It is important that our learners feel happy and supported in order to achieve their best in the classroom.

Our Pastoral team consists of both teaching and non-teaching staff who are available to offer support and guidance to learners in an effective and timely manner. As such we would ask that you emphasise with your child that they should approach a member of staff in the first instance should a problem or issue arise, rather than contacting home. By giving staff an opportunity to resolve any concerns we will be able to reduce any unnecessary worry for both you and your son / daughter.

Medical Room

We have a small medical room which is managed by a first aid officer.

Learners visiting the medical room will be assessed and a decision on the next course of action will be made by the first aid officer, i.e. learner receives treatment, a phone call home is made or returns to class.

Learners should familiarise themselves with the protocol below before visiting the medical room:

Learners:

O. What should I do if I feel unwell in a lesson?

A. Tell your teacher and he/she will give you a yellow exit slip to leave the classroom to go to the medical room in learner reception.

Q. What should I do if I feel unwell at break time or lunchtime? (If the bell goes for the start of the lesson, you must go to your lesson and speak to your teacher.)

A. Go to learner reception and the staff there will help you.

Q. Should I contact my parents/carers and ask to be collected?

A. No, the staff on learner reception will contact home if you need to be sent home.

Reminder. You should not use your mobile phone whilst in the school building unless you are in one of the designated areas during lunch or break time.

Q. Who can give me permission to go home if I am unwell?

A. Your Head of Year or Head of Key Stage or a Senior Member of Staff.

Parents and carers:


