This was organised through Keep Wales Tidy but is actually part of the WG programme "My Tree, Our Forest" which is in conjunction with the Woodland Trust. The whole project is aimed at increasing both the awareness of trees globally, reforestation,









and minimising deforestation in the fight against climate change. For us as a school, the aim is to plant our own mini woodland area and create an extension of the nature hedgerow to extend along the school's new perimeter. These "green corridors" are essential in helping to support biodiversity in the local ecosystem and provide very important shelters for a wide variety of fauna and flora. The choices of trees themselves is also hugely important, as they are all native welsh species, helping to sustain and promote our natural environment.



Exams

During May and June we have GCSE examinations taking place. It is extremely important that learners are in school during this period in order not to miss any exams that they are entered in. We politely ask that holidays are not booked during this time.

Biometrics

The school is using a Biometric payment system for catering, which is a quicker and easier way for learners to purchase food/drinks from the school canteen.

If you wish to register your son/daughter for this system, forms are available from the school reception. Once we have received the completed form learners will be registered the same day. This is a more efficient way for them to get their lunch instead of them remembering a 4 digit code. Alternatively you can contact us at admin@lliswerryhigh.org given authorisation for your child to have biometrics set up.

Contact Details

Please make sure we have your most up to date contact details, also that you don't have the school number blocked. During this academic year we struggled to make contact with a few parents when making calls home. Please also note that if we call, it may show on your phone as 'number withheld'.

Schoolgateway



Communicate Easier, Faster and More Effectively

Using School Gateway means that we can communicate with parents quickly and cost effectively via email, text or smartphone. It will also allow us to send electronic reports in future.



If you have a smartphone, you can help us save money by downloading the 'School Gateway' app from your app store (Android and iPhone).

By doing this we can send you app messages (avoiding the cost of texts) and you can send messages back for FREE. It's quick and easy to do.

All you need is your email address and mobile number that school holds on record for you. If you have trouble logging in, please contact the school.

All communication will be sent via Schoolgateway.

Learner Support

At Lliswerry High we want to create an outstanding climate for learning. It is important that our learners feel happy and supported in order to achieve their best in the classroom.

Our Pastoral team consists of both teaching and non-teaching staff who are available to offer support and guidance to learners in an effective and timely manner. As such we would ask that you emphasise with your child that they should approach a member of staff in the first instance should a problem or issue arise, rather than contacting home. By giving staff an opportunity to resolve any concerns, we will be able to reduce any unnecessary worry for both you and your son / daughter.

Medical Room

We have a small medical room which is managed by a first aid officer.

Learners visiting the medical room will be assessed and a decision on the next course of action will be made by the first aid officer, i.e. learner receives treatment, a phone call home is made or returns to class.

Learners should familiarise themselves with the protocol below before visiting the medical room:

Learners:

Q. What should I do if I feel unwell in a lesson?

A. Tell your teacher and he/she will give you a yellow exit slip to leave the classroom to go to the medical room in learner reception.

Q. What should I do if I feel unwell at break time or lunchtime? (If the bell goes for the start of the lesson, you must go to your lesson and speak to your teacher.)

A. Go to learner reception and the staff there will help you.

Q. Should I contact my parents/carers and ask to be collected?

A. No, the staff on learner reception will contact home if you need to be sent home.

Reminder. You should not use your mobile phone whilst in the school building unless you are in one of the designated areas during lunch or break time.

Q. Who can give me permission to go home if I am unwell?

A. Your Head of Year or Head of Key Stage or a Senior Member of Staff.

Parents and carers:

We have recently had a number of parents/carers called to school by their children without the staff having any knowledge of a learner feeling unwell. Parents/carers are asked for their support in the process above and to wait for the school to contact them to collect their child.



2023/2024 Free School Meal & Pupil Development (PDG) Application for Newport Schools Important Information for Parents / Carers

Universal Primary Free School Meals

The Welsh Government are working with Local Authorities in Wales to deliver Universal Primary Free School Meals to all primary aged pupils by 2024 on a rollout basis.

In Newport, we are able offer ALL primary aged pupils a Free School Meal from September 2023.

Families of children attending Primary School in September 2023 do not need to apply for the school meal offer as they will be automatically able to claim this at their school. However, families on low incomes may be eligible to claim the School Essentials grant (formerly known as Pupil Development Grant or PDG), please see below.

Free School Meals for Low Income Families

If you are on a low income and your child/children are **not** already receiving Free School Meals, you will need to make an application. You can only claim the School Essentials Grant if your child/children are in receipt of Free School Meals. This is subject to eligibility.

You MUST complete all sections on the application form and sign the declaration. Incomplete forms will result in a delay of any Free School Meals or School Essentials Grant payment whilst we contact you to gain the missing information.

ELIGIBILITY - Pupils will be eligible for a Free School Meal and a School Essentials Grant if parents/carers are in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Income Support or Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (the annual income must be less than £16,190 for the household)
 NOTE: if you are in receipt of Working Tax Credit, you will NOT be eligible to receive Free School Meals nor a School Essentials Grant
- Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit, provided the household has an annualised net earned income of no more than £7400.

When you make your claim for Free School Meals, your Local Authority will check your eligibility using the eligibility checking system. This process works by looking at a claimant's earnings for up to three of the most recent assessment periods, starting with the most recent and working back. If we need further information, we will contact you.

Renewal claims

If your children are currently entitled to Free School Meals and attending a Newport School, your Free School Meals award will continue into the next academic year and we will be able to check your on-going eligibility for the School Essentials Grant without the need for you to complete a new form (unless we contact you under separate cover).

Transitional Protection

Pupils entitled to Free School Meals on or after 01 April 2019 will have their eligibility protected and this will apply to the end of the rollout of Universal Credit (currently scheduled for December 2023), regardless of whether their circumstances change.

Once the rollout of Universal Credit has completed, transitional protection will continue until the child comes to the end of their current phase of education i.e. primary/secondary school.

Please note that if you cease to be eligible for Free School Meals but continue to receive them due to transitional protection only, you will NOT be entitled to the School Essentials Grant regardless of what year your child is entering in September 2023.

Notes

We are able to check your entitlement; there is no need to supply proof of eligibility unless requested.

School Essentials Grant 2023/2024

The grant for the academic year from September 2023 will open from 01st July 2023

Pupils who are eligible to a Free School Meal based on the eligibility criteria above may also entitled to a School Essentials Grant if they are entering reception class in primary school, years 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10 or 11 or if they are in a special school, special needs resource unit or pupil referral unit and are aged 4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14 or 15.

The funding is also available to all looked after children of compulsory school age.

Pupils with no recourse to public funds entering Reception, Years 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10 and 11 in the 2023/2024 school year can also be considered for this funding.

The School Essentials Grant is to provide essistance to families on low incomes for the purchase of:

- School uniform including coats and shoes;
- School sports kit including footwear;
- Uniform for enrichment activities, including but not limited to, scouts; guides; cadets; martial arts; sports; performing arts or dance;
- Equipment e.g. school bags and stationary;
- Specialist equipment where new curriculum activities begin such as design and technology;
- · Laptops or tablets; and

Equipment for out of school hour's trips such as outdoor learning e.g. waterproofs.

Please contact your school to find out if equipment is available before purchasing any.

A payment of £125 per pupil will be made for all qualifying school years with the exception of pupils entering Year 7 who will each receive a payment of £200.

Please provide your bank details on your application in order for this payment to be made. Payment has to be paid into a bank account. We are unable to make payments into a Post Office account. Failure to provide this information could result in a delay in issuing this payment to you.

Applications for the School Essentials Grant can only be considered for pupils attending schools within the Newport Local Authority and only one grant payment can be claimed in any one academic year.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

CHANGES IN YOUR CIRCUMSTANCES - It is your responsibility to notify the Housing Benefits Team of any changes to financial/family circumstances. Failure to notify the Housing Benefits Team could result in you being charged the full cost of any school meals taken by your Children from the date your circumstances changed. You may also have to pay back any School Essentials Grant payment that you received but were not entitled to due to your failure to disclose important information.

If your children move to a different Newport school during the school year, please contact the Housing Benefits Team so that we can amend your award and inform the new school of their entitlement:

You cannot make a claim for children who are accessing a part-time nursery place.

DECIDED NOT TO APPLY?

The Welsh Government gives an extra grant for every child that is entitled to and claims free school meals (based upon the eligibility criteria for lower income families). It can be an extra bonus for your child's school so we would urge you to make a claim.

School meals offer a healthy option with significant nutritional benefits and recent evidence suggests that having a healthy meal at lunch time can assist in improving a child's performance and concentration during the day.


