

WALES YOUTH COP CLIMATE CHANGE EVENT

In November 2022, nine of our environmentally aware Year 10 learners were

able to attend the Wales Youth COP Climate Change event at The Temple of Peace in Cardiff. This was the first such event to be held in Wales and was designed to attract young people with a keen interest in environmental issues. There were opportunities for our learners to ask questions and to speak to a range of organisations and groups from across Wales about their work on climate change and their efforts to reduce emissions. Some also had opportunities for their voices to be heard when they were interviewed by the media. The event was organised by Size of Wales, a Welsh charity with a focus on climate and tropical forests and the Youth Climate Ambassadors for Wales. It was sponsored and funded by the Welsh Government. Having attended the event our learners hope to build upon links made with the Welsh Government and plan to set up an environmental

CHAOS SCIENCE DAY



In the Summer, all Year 7 & 8 learners were able to benefit from an hour's 'hands on' science session with students from Cambridge University. These demonstrations varied greatly from the biology of blood and x rays, the chemistry of a reaction to the physics of a vortex! 

Biometrics

The school is using a Biometric payment system for catering, which is a quicker and easier way for learners to purchase food/drinks from the school canteen.

If you wish to register your son/daughter for this system, forms are available from the school reception. Once we have received the completed form learners will be registered the same day. This is a more efficient way for them to get their lunch instead of them remembering a 4 digit code. KEY INFORMATION

Learner Support

At Lliswerry High we want to create an outstanding climate for learning. It is important that our learners feel happy and supported in order to achieve their best in the classroom.

Our Pastoral team consists of both teaching and non-teaching staff who are available to offer support and guidance to learners in an effective and timely manner. As such we would ask that you emphasise with your child that they should approach a member of staff in the first instance should a problem or issue arise, rather than contacting home. By giving staff an opportunity to resolve any concerns, we will be able to reduce any unnecessary worry for both you and your son / daughter.

Medical Room

We have a small medical room which is managed by a first aid officer.

Learners visiting the medical room will be assessed and a decision on the next course of action will be made by the first aid officer, i.e. learner receives treatment, a phone call home is made or returns to class.

Learners should familiarise themselves with the protocol below before visiting the medical room:

Learners:

Q. What should I do if I feel unwell in a lesson?

A. Tell your teacher and he/she will give you a yellow exit slip to leave the classroom to go to the medical room in learner reception.

Q. What should I do if I feel unwell at break time or lunchtime? (If the bell goes for the start of the lesson, you must go to your lesson and speak to your teacher.)

A. Go to learner reception and the staff there will help you.

Q. Should I contact my parents/carers and ask to be collected?

A. No, the staff on learner reception will contact home if you need to be sent home.

Reminder. You should not use your mobile phone whilst in the school building unless you are in one of the designated areas during lunch or break time.

Q. Who can give me permission to go home if I am unwell?

A. Your Head of Year or Head of Key Stage or a Senior Member of Staff.

Parents and carers:




