#### Year 7 Royal Navy

On Wednesday, Year 7 took part in a science workshop with the Royal Navy. The workshop involved learners using their science knowledge and teamwork skills to design a new rocket which could be used for transferring fuel from one ship to another. It was also a great opportunity to learn about the many roles the Royal Navy has. During the workshop, Year 7 explored the science behind the forces acting on a rocket as it travels through the air. This links to a project we will be doing later in the term on forces. At the end of the workshop, learners were able to complete with each other to see who had designed the most effective rocket. This involved using a mechanical air pump to fire the paper rockets across the yard. It was great to see these rockets travel huge distances. The winning team in each session received 10 positive points.
