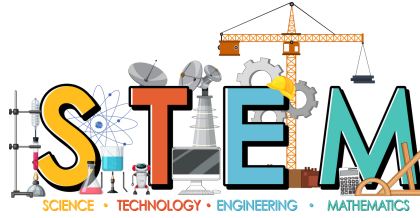
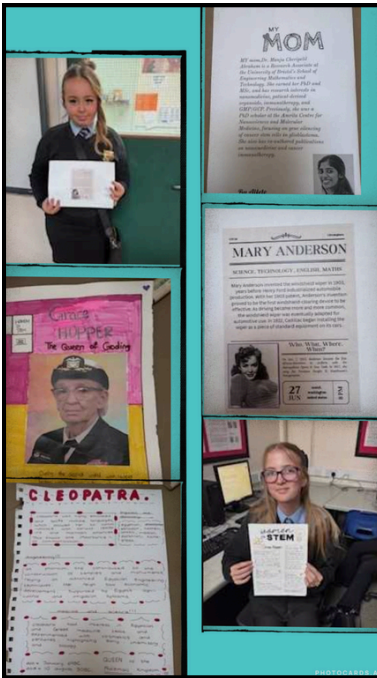

Year 8 Girls STEM

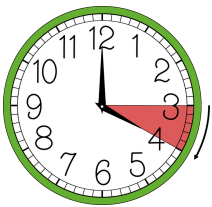
